

### STP Priorities & Outcome Measures – 2018/19

The following priorities and draft outcome measures were agreed at the STP Executive Group on 18<sup>th</sup> May 2018. This excludes priorities for CBC, which will be reviewed at the July Clinical Programme Board.

#### **Urgent and Emergency Care**

1. *Better same day urgent care*  
Reducing ambulance conveyances to ED by April 2019
2. *Improving patient flow*  
Frailty services 70 hours per week linked to all EDs by April 2019
3. *Enabling excellent care (linking to workforce and digital enablers)*  
Medical rotas that meet 7 day working standards by October 2018.

#### **Mental Health**

1. *Reducing out of area placements to zero*  
Number of placements by April 2019
2. *Increasing access to IAPT services*  
*Agreed best practice model for those with LTCs implemented by April 2019*
3. *Increasing access to individual placement support*
4. *An increased percentage of people with SMI in employment, education or training by April 2019*
4. *Workforce capacity (linked to the national mental health workforce targets)*  
*Meeting the milestones within the mental health workforce plan*
5. *Children and Young People's mental health*  
*See CYP below*

#### **Children and Young People**

1. *Special Educational Needs and Disability services*  
Complete a baseline review of services by reviewing CQC/ Ofsted reports. By April 2019 to have in place a core SE London offer which is understood by families accessing the service
2. *Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services (CAMHS)*  
To reduce variation across SEL using IAF data as a baseline. To see a measurable improvement in Tier 3/4 CAMHS working with SLP.
3. *Long Term conditions and Urgent and Emergency Care linked to previous work on short stay paediatric assessment units*  
To reduce unplanned admissions to ED/ SSPAU for children with a pre-existing asthma diagnosis.

#### **Maternity**

1. *Implementation of the 'Better Births' plan priorities*  
Connected digital systems across SEL for maternity by April 2019  
Meeting targets for 18/19 in line with 'halve it' ambition for still births  
20% of women report continuity of carer by April 2019

#### **Cancer**

1. *Optimisation of screening uptake and coverage*

- Bowel screening pilot for people with LD in all 6 boroughs by end of 2018
2. *Earlier diagnosis*  
Straight to test models in place by end of July 2018
  3. *Networked acute oncology service*  
In place by April 2019
  4. *Development of stratified follow up for prostate and breast cancer patients*  
Introduced by April 2019
  5. *Supporting care closer to home*  
Measured as part of (4) above

**Planned Care**

1. *Development of an orthopaedic network for elective care covering the three acute providers and ensuring consistent and sustainable outcomes*  
Draft metrics to be discussed with the Clinical Programme Board in July 2018 and agreed in September 2018.
